


Moving to Year 4





- Children will develop their independence further this year as they continue in Key Stage 2.
- In English, they will begin to use a range of different grammar skills, sentence types, punctuation and spelling features in their writing.
- In mathematics, they will work on their times tables knowledge in preparation for the official Multiplication Checks in June. Children will also build on their core skills of adding and subtracting while deepening their thinking. We will also be working on time, fractions, decimals and shape.

Autumn Term – Invasions

This project teaches children about the characteristics and features of rivers and mountain ranges around the world, including a detailed exploration of the ecosystems and processes that shape them and the land around them.


Summer Term – Ancient Civilisations

Children to change their reading books as needed. Please bring reading books and reading records into school every day.

Reading records will be checked every Friday so please record how many times your child has been reading.

Times Tables







 Your child will be expected to know all multiplication facts by the end of Year 4.

- In Year 1 and 2, children learn the 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- By the end of Year 3, children should be fluent in the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10 times tables
- Then, by the end of Year 4 children should know all their times tables up to 12 i.e. the 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 times tables.

Multiplication Check







- All children in Year 4 will sit the official Multiplication check in June.
- There are 25 random questions for the children to answer in 6 seconds.
- We will practice weekly in school so children are prepared and ready to perform to the best of their abilities
- There is no 'pass' mark
- Used to inform teachers and upcoming teachers of areas of need and helps build the crucial foundations of times table knowledge for Year 5 and Year 6

How can you help?

- We are always eager to invite parents and carers to support with reading in school. If you are able to give some time, please see your child's class teacher.
- Talking with your child about school. Being familiar with the topics we cover will allow you to ask specific questions and avoid the classic response of 'we did nothing today!'
- Times table practice
- Wider reading



How can you help?

- Instead of 'How was school?'
- 1. Tell me about the best part of your day.
- 2. What was the hardest thing you had to do today?
- 3. Did any of your classmates do anything funny?
- 4. Tell me about what you read in class.
- 5. Who did you play with today? What did you play?
- 6. Do you think math [or any subject] is too easy or too hard?
- 7. What's the biggest difference between this year and last year?
- 8. What rules are different at school than our rules at home? Do you think they're fair?
- 9. Who did you sit with at lunch?
- 10. Can you show me something you learned (or did) today?
