

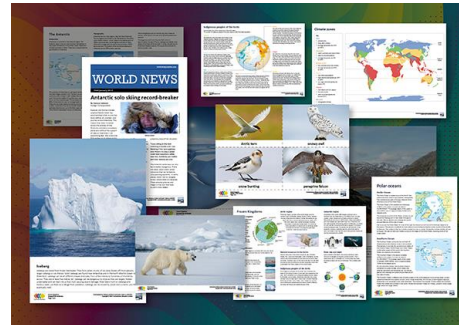


Our topic for this Term in Year 6 is 'Frozen Kingdoms'

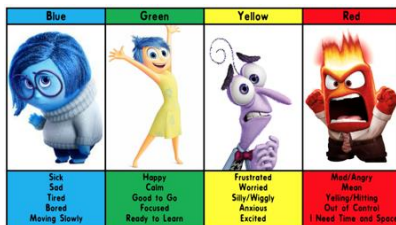

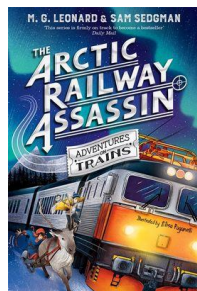
All uniform should be clearly named.
